The Detroit Tigers beat out the Chicago Cubs four games to three, earning them the 1945 world title in baseball.

Maurice "The Rocket" Richard became the first NHL player to score 50 goals in a season.

August 5, 1945, First Atomic Bomb Dropped on Hiroshima, Japan.

The world's first atomic bomb, Little Boy, is dropped on Hiroshima, Japan, from the Enola Gay, a B-29 bomber piloted by Colonel Tibbets of the 509th Composite Group, the first military unit in history to drop a nuclear bomb in combat. One minute after explosion there were 66,000 killed and 69,000 wounded.
